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#### **Concept of Safety**

The concept of **safety culture** originated outside healthcare, in studies of **high reliability organizations** (HRO)



organizations that consistently minimize adverse events,

despite carrying out intrinsically complex and hazardous work.


There is a **commitment to safety at all levels**, from frontline providers to managers and executives.

#### **Culture of Safety**



Acknowledgement of the high-risk nature of an organization's activities and the determination to achieve consistently safe operations.



A blame-free environment where individuals are able to report errors or near misses without fear of reprimand or punishment.



Encouragement of collaboration across ranks and disciplines to seek solutions to patient safety problems.



Organizational commitment of resources to address safety concerns.

#### **MAGNITUDE: 1 IN 4**

 As many as 1 in 4 patients are harmed whilst receiving primary and ambulatory healthcare



#### INCIDENCE: 134 MILLION

 134 million adverse events occur each year in hospitals in low- and middleincome countries, contributing to 2.6 million deaths annually due to unsafe care.




#### **MEDICATIONS: \$42 BILLION**

Medication errors cost an estimated 42 billion USD annually.

In 2013 Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) surveyed healthcare workers and found:









### **Culture of Safety Elements**

Environmental structures and processes

The attitudes and perceptions of workers

Safety-related behaviors of individuals

\*Leadership engagement is also a critical factor in the development of a culture of safety.



#### **AHRQ Surveys**

- AHRQ has a survey available for download to use with your facility and medical staff to assess the culture of safety at your facility.
- The survey should be conducted anonymously to allow staff to be honest in their responses.
- Use this data for a QI study to enact change.
- TJC is now requiring accredited facilities to review culture of safety on an annual basis.


### **Develop the Culture**

Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality have surveys that can be downloaded and used to survey facility staff, and medical staff on the culture of safety at your surgery center. The Joint Commission now requires you to review the culture of safety on an annual basis, this is a great tool to use to
